FEL is leading on the development of a Sustainable Food Places partnership for Falkirk and Climate Action, this role will also contribute towards this work.

Specialist Activity

- Design, and deliver a range of activities that support people and communities to grow food, in a variety of community growing settings e.g. allotments, community gardens
- Support communities by signposting to relevant events, organisations and community support.
- Organise events throughout the project year, encouraging and supporting communities to interact and engage with the project.
- Support a programme of learning and mentoring, with community volunteers to access learning and support and to build capacity that help them to support others and community organisations grow food.
- Support community leaders to develop funding bids and develop partnerships that help them deliver their ambitions with respect to the climate agenda and community food growing agenda.
- Collaborate with the project partners, keeping them informed of progress, assisting with project communications, sharing learning and co-developing the project legacy.
- Work alongside key partners such as NHS Forth Valley, local authority, third sector interfaces
 and a range of third and community organisations, to improve the local food system, sustainable
 transport system, sharing economy that help people to Live Well Locally.
- Be responsible for data collection, report writing and monitoring and evaluation.
- Support the engagement and development of Climate action hub proposal for Forth Valley.
- Continue to develop and innovate FEL's programme of activity, using best practice to ensure it remains relevant and effective.
- Be innovative and able to develop wider initiatives that complement FEL's wider climate action agenda
- Support funding applications in support of programme delivery.
- Deal with customer care enquiries including communication by telephone, face-to-face, email, and social media.
- Be the public face of FEL across a variety of platforms (including face to face and digital).

Core Activity

- Work in partnership with other initiatives within the local community groups to promote and increase climate action, key themes include active travel, food and growing, sharing economy.
- Participate in local events and partnership events to promote FEL's wider active travel agenda.
- To promote FEL's work and encourage participation through a range of communication channels including using social media.
- Contribute to the development and upkeep of FEL physical spaces, websites, events diaries, blogs and monthly mail outs.
- To work closely with Forth Environment Link's other programmes and initiatives.
- Carry out other duties which may reasonably be required in light of the main purpose of the job.
