





Forth Valley Climate Action Hub Funding for Community-Led Climate Action Climate Leadership Programme 2025-26

FEL Scotland is excited to roll out its innovative Climate Leadership Programme for a second consecutive year. This flexible programme aims to equip a cohort of emerging climate leaders with the skills, confidence and capacity to lead climate action in their communities, while building peer support and unlocking resources. Candidates completing the programme will be awarded a small grant via the organistions they represent to support them to lead and inspire climate action within their community. The Climate Leadership Programme is joined by second rounds of Womens Climate Leadership Fund and First Steps and Next Steps grants. Grants are available to eligible FEL member organisations only.

What is the Climate Action Hub?

FEL Scotland is one of more than 20 organisations and partnerships funded by Scottish Government to deliver Climate Action Hubs at a regional level. Climate Action Hubs are a ground-breaking initiative from Scottish Government's Net Zero campaign designed to empower communities to increase climate awareness and deliver their own climate actions. Hubs offer a range of support to meet local priorities and needs, from helping people to better understand what is happening to our environment, how they may be impacted and what they can do to adapt to changes, to learning from others who are taking steps to mitigate or adapt in their own parts of Scotland. Hubs aim to both inspire communities and provide knowledge, connections and practical support.

Forth Valley Climate Action Hub, hosted by FEL Scotland, networks with communities across the region to support them to respond to the climate emergency at a local level. Providing small grants for community-led climate action is one of the ways we do this.

FEL Scotland is grateful to *Foundation Scotland* for its investment into Forth Valley Climate Action Hub which has helped to make a third consecutive year of grant giving possible

How much can I apply for?

Community groups represented by participants who complete the Climate Leadership Programme are invited to apply for up to £1,000







What is the aim of the programme?

The Climate Hub Leadership Programme aims to bring together a small cohort of participants for a flexible training itinerary focused on climate adaptation to boost community resilience. Participants who graduate by completing the minimum attendance requirements of the programme are eligible for a small grant of £1,000, payable to the constituted group they represent. The aim of the grant is to contribute towards the ongoing delivery of climate actions, public engagement or awareness raising in participant communities.

The programme will focus on how we adapt to our changing climate to ensure our communities are better prepared for its impacts at a local level.

How is the programme structured?

The three-part curated programme will comprise of:

- 1. Practical knowledge and skills
- 2. Leadership skills
- 3. Place based learning & inspiration

Participants are required to attend at least three workshops or events and participate in one or more peer sharing or action planning session in order to graduate from and become eligible for the grant. These events can be selected from the Hub's full list of events which will take place throughout the year. This flexible approach means participants can tailor their learning to their priorities and interests, as well as to their schedules.

What can participants expect to achieve?

- An enhanced peer network
- Increased knowledge on specific areas of climate adaptation
- Enhanced leadership capacity and resilience

Who Can Apply?

This fund is open to FEL Scotland members based in Clackmannanshire, Falkirk or Stirling Council boundaries, including any area of the Loch Lomond and the Trossachs National Park that fall under Stirling Council. Constituted community groups, community councils, community development trusts, community interest companies (CICs) and similar not-for-profit groups with governance in place that meet all eligibility criteria may apply.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible the lead applicant organisation should be an FEL member and provide evidence of all the following:

- A bank account in the organisation's name (not an individual's name)
- A committee with at least 3 unrelated members
- A constitution or similar governing document
- Most recent audited signed accounts, or similar evidence of financial management
- Most recent bank statement

If your group isn't able to provide accounts or any of the other documents requested, please get in touch to discuss alternatives. Assistance can be provided by our partner Third Sector Interfaces, CTSI (Clackmannanshire); CVS (Falkirk); and SVE (Stirling) all of which can also provide advice and practical support around governance.

Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults

Please note that it is a condition of grant that the recipient organisation has a policy and procedure in place relating to the Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults (PCVA). Guidance on PCVA can be found at:

What costs are eligible?

Eligible costs include:

- Venue or equipment hire including catering
- Marketing & promotion
- Material and supplies
- Reasonable travel costs (excluding flights)
- Engagement tools
- Fees relating to learning exchange visits
- Volunteer expenses
- Training costs
- Commissioning research
- Fees of consultants or specialists where essential to achieving project aims

We may ask for evidence that best value is achieved for any single purchases exceeding £500+ If you are not sure what costs are eligible, please get in touch.

What costs are not eligible?

- Salary costs are not eligible
- Capital costs or contribution to larger capital costs in other projects you may be running
 are not eligible. Capital costs are defined as a cost incurred on the purchase of land,
 buildings, construction and equipment to be used in the production of goods or the
 rendering of services.
- Costs incurred out with the funded project, or incurred prior to the project start date are not eligible

What are the important dates?

- Applications open on 19 August 2025
- The closing date for applications is 12pm, 12 September
- Applicants can expect to hear if their submission has been successful within two weeks
